Viterbo, approximately 65 kilometers north of Rome, is the capital of Tuscia. Located on a volcanic area, the city origin dates back to the Etruscan era. During the middle ages, the small town developed into a flourishing city. Nowadays, thanks to its medieval quarters, palaces and fountains, Viterbo is considered to have one of the most beautiful and bestpreserved historic centers in Italy. It is known as "the city of a hundred fountains" and "the city of the Popes": the Cathedral and the Papal Palace are a remnant of the golden era in which it became seat of the papacy. In addition, many remarkable buildings are worth a visit: Palazzo Comunale, the Church of Santa Rosa, Palazzo Farnese and the Civic Museum, which houses a wonderful collection of archaeological finds and an art gallery. Viterbo is home of the University of Tuscia, which is the academic reference for the entire province. It also hosts many cultural and traditional festivals such as the Macchina of Santa Rosa, a procession in which a hundred porters hoist a thirty-meter high tower and carry it through the streets. This yearly event is included in the UNESCO Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity. Moreover, the city is located in a thermal area, a fact that attracts many tourists, and its surroundings are known for their wellpreserved medieval villages and charming natural landscapes.
